## 1. 5ኛው የኢትዮጵያ የዓለም ንግድ ድርጅት የሥራ ቡድን ስብሰባ ተጠናቀቀ

ኢዜአ: መጋቢት 10/2017

በስዊዘርላንድ ጄኔቫ ሲካሎድ የቆየው 5ኛው የኢትዮጵያ የዓለም ንግድ ድርጅት የሥራ ቡድን ስብሰባ ተጠናቋል።

የንግድና ቀጣናዊ ትስስር ሚኒስትር ካሳሁን ጎሬ(ዶ/ር) በማህበራዊ ትስስር ገጻቸው 5ኛው የሀገራችን የአለም ንግድ ድርጅት የሥራ ቡድን ስብሰባ በስኬት ተጠናቋል ሲሉ አስፍረዋል።

በተለያዩ የድርድር ነጥቦች ዙሪያ ከ110 በላይ ጥያቄዎችን በመቀበል ውጤታማ ድርድር ያካሄደው የድርድር ቡድኖችን ማምሻውን ድርድሩን አጠናቅቋል ሲሉም ገልጸዋል።

የሚቀጥለው ስድስተኛው የሥራ ቡድን ስብሰባም በያዝነው ዓመት ሐምሌ ወር ላይ እንዲካሄድ ከስምምነት ደርሰናል ብለዋል።

ኢትዮጵያ በ2018 ካሜሩን ላይ በሚካሄደው 14ኛው የዓለም ንግድ ሚኒስትሮች ስብሰባ፤ የዓለም ንግድ ቤተሰብን እንድትቀላቀል ሁላችንም የራሳችንን የቤት ሥራ ለመሥራት ተስማምተን ድርድራችንን ቋጭተናል ብለዋል።

በሚቀጥሉት ጥቂት ቀናትም ቀሪ የሁለተኛው ድርድሮችን ጨምሮ ከጽሕፈት ቤቱ ጋር የሚደረጉ ውይይቶች እንደሚኖሩም ገልጸዋል።

## 2. የንግድ ትርጉሞች ለምርትና አገልግሎቶች ተወዳዳሪነት

በኢትዮጵያ የንግድና ማኅበራት ምክር ቤት እና የንግድና ቀጣናዊ ትስስር በጋራ የተዘጋጀው ይህ ኤግዚቢሽን ከመጋቢት 4 ቀን 2017 ጀምሮ ለተከታታይ አምስት ቀናት ነው የተካሄደው። በንግድ ትርጉሞች በርካታ የአገር ውስጥ አምራቾች እና ዓለም አቀፍ የንግድ ድርጅቶች ተሳትፈውበታል። በዋናነት የንግድ አካላት የእርስ በእርስ ትውውቅ እና ትስስር፣ የቴክኖሎጂ፣ የእውቀት እና የንግድ ልውውጥ ያደረጉበትና ሽማቾችም ምርቶችን አገልግሎቶችን መሸመት የቻሉበት ነው።

በኤግዚቢሽኑ መክፈቻ ላይ የተገኙት የንግድና ቀጣናዊ ትስስር ሚኒስትር ካሳሁን ጎሬ (ዶክተር) እንደተናገሩት፤ የኢትዮጵያ የንግድና ዘርፍ ማህበራት ምክር ቤት እና በየደረጃው ያሉ የማህበራት ምክር ቤቶች በአዋጅ በተሰጣቸው ስልጣንና ኃላፊነት መሰረት በንግድና አገልግሎት እንዲሁም በአምራች ዘርፍ በመሰማራት በአገሪቱ የኢኮኖሚ እንቅስቃሴ ውስጥ ጉልህ ሚና እየተጫወቱ ይገኛሉ።

የኢትዮጵያ የንግድና የዘርፍ ማኅበራት ምክር ቤት ፕሬዚደንት አቶ ሰብስብ አባሬራ በበኩላቸው እንዳሉት ምክር ቤቱ የተቋቋመው በኢትዮጵያ የኢኮኖሚ እንቅስቃሴ ውስጥ የመሪነት ሚና የሚጫወት ጠንካራ እና ዘላቂ አቅም ያለው የግል ዘርፍ በመፍጠር ንግድና ኢንቨስትመንትን ለማሳለጥ ነው።

የግሉ ዘርፍ በአገሪቱ ሰፊ የልማት እንቅስቃሴ ውስጥ ወሳኝ ሚና መጫወት የሚያስችሉት ፖሊሲዎች ተቀርፀው ተግባራዊ መሆን ከጀመሩ አንስቶ ዘርፉ ደረጃ በደረጃ በኢኮኖሚው ውስጥ የራሱን ድርሻ አያበረከተ መሆኑን ፕሬዚዳንቱ ተናግረዋል።

የኢትዮጵያ የንግድና ዘርፍ ማኅበራት ምክር ቤት ዋና ፀሐፊ ቀንኒሳ ለሚ (ዶ/ር) በበኩላቸው እንደተናገሩት፤ ይህ የኢትዮጵያን ይግዙ ኤግዚቢሽን ለ13 ተከታታይ ዓመታት ተካሂዷል። በዘንድሮው ኤግዚቢሽን ላይ የኢትዮጵያ ኢንተርፕራይዞችና ኩባንያዎችን ጨምሮ ከሕንድ፣ ከሳዊዲያ አረቢያ፣ ከቻይና፣ ከታይዋን እና ከሌሎች የመካከለኛው ምስራቅ አገራት የመጡ ከ300 እስከ 400 የሚደርሱ የቢዝነስ ተቋማት ተሳትፈውበታል።

ዋና ጸሀፊው፤ የንግድ ትርጉሞች የኢትዮጵያ ምርት እና አገልግሎት በዓለም ገበያ ይበልጥ ታዋቂና ተወዳዳሪ እንዲሆን እንደሚያግዝ ገልጸው፤ ተሳታፊዎቹ የእርስ በእርስ የቴክኖሎጂ ሽግግር የሚያደርጉበት መሆኑንም አስታውቀዋል። ቴክኖሎጂዎችን በምን መልኩ አገኛለሁ የሚለውን መልስ እንዲሁም ተፈላጊ ቴክኖሎጂዎችን ማወቅ እንደሚያስችልም አመለካከተዋል።

## 3. ከቡና፣ ሻይና ቅመማ ቅመም ምርት ወጪ ንግድ ከ1 ነጥብ 2 ቢሊዮን ዶላር በላይ ተገኘ

ኤፍ.ኤም.ሲ : መጋቢት 5፣ 2017

ባለፉት ስምንት ወራት 269 ሺህ 114 ነጥብ 42 ቶን የቡና፣ ሻይና ቅመማ ቅመም ምርት ለውጪ ገበያ በማቅረብ 1 ቢሊዮን 235 ሚሊዮን የአሜሪካ ዶላር ገቢ መገኘቱ ተገለጸ። አፈጻጸሙ ካለፈው በጀት ዓመት ተመሳሳይ ወቅት ጋር ሲነጻጸር፤ በ112 ሺህ 618 ነጥብ 66 ቶን እና በ512 ነጥብ 71 ሚሊዮን ዶላር ብልጫ ማሳየቱን የኢትዮጵያ ቡናና ሻይ ባለስልጣን አረጋግጧል። በሥምንት ወራት ውስጥ 257 ሺህ 248 ነጥብ 79 ቶን ቡና ለውጪ ገበያ ተልኮ፤ 1 ቢሊዮን 226 ነጥብ 8 ሚሊዮን የአሜሪካ ዶላር ገቢ መገኘቱን የባለስልጣኑ መረጃ አመለካከቷል። ይህ አፈጻጸም ካለፈው በጀት ዓመት ተመሳሳይ ወቅት ጋር ሲነጻጸር፤ በ106 ሺህ 818 ነጥብ 24 ቶን እና በ510 ነጥብ 48 ሚሊዮን የአሜሪካ ዶላር ጭማሪ ማሳየቱም ተጠቅሷል።

## 4. Authority slaps heavy fines on paper-based securities with new directive

The Ethiopian Capital Market Authority has imposed stringent penalties on the issuance and use of paper-based securities as part of a bold push to modernize securities trading in the country.

Effective upon registration with the Ministry of Justice, the directive levies fines starting at 100,000 Ethiopian birr and escalating by 10,000 birr daily for issuers who continue to issue physical certificates after the dematerialization deadline.

This crackdown, targeting an estimated over a million security holders, aims at transitioning to a secure electronic system, aiming to eliminate fraud and enhance market efficiency.

The directive, detailed across 33 articles and eight sections, mandates that all publicly offered securities—including those from state-owned enterprises and regional offerings—be dematerialized and registered with the Central Securities Depository (CSD).

Issuers face a minimum fine of 100,000 birr, with a maximum of 500,000 birr, for issuing physical certificates post-effectiveness, alongside a daily penalty of 10,000 birr until compliance is achieved following an authority request for rectification.

## 5. Implementation of AfCFTA Needs Patience, Strategy

Implementing the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) is not a one-time event but a comprehensive and ongoing process that requires patience, tact and strategic planning - Riyad Mezzour, Chair of the Bureau of African Ministers of Finance and Economic Planning, has explained. He was speaking at a press conference to highlight and explain some of the decisions made at the fifty-seventh session of the Economic Commission for Africa: Conference of African Ministers of Finance, Planning, and Economic Development, which was held from 12 to 18 March 2025 in Addis Ababa.

The conference was under the theme “Advancing the Implementation of the Agreement Establishing the African Continental Free Trade Area: Proposing Transformative Strategic Actions” Riyad Mezzour, who is also Morocco’s Minister of Industry and Trade, stated that the conference acknowledged the necessity for transformative actions to enhance the implementation of the AfCFTA. It emphasized the importance of activating regional value chains to bolster integration and highlighted the need for coordinated efforts to eliminate barriers that hinder the promotion of intra-African trade.

He further explained that the conference also explored the role of digitalisation in Africa’s economic transformation, investment in digital infrastructure and skills.

It also the need for the empowerment of African youth in relation to the AfCFTA through increased investments in education, training, and entrepreneurship, and prioritizing climate change and sustainable development while promoting sustainable trade practices.

He argued that achieving these objectives require strong political will and effective decision-making to promote collaboration among member states. The Executive Secretary of the ECA, Claver Gatete pointed out that the changing global landscape, marked by increasingly limited investments and aid directed toward African nations, highlights the urgent need for the continent to promote intra-African trade and investment through AfCFTA.

## 6. Special Economic Zones, Investments Position Ethiopia in Optimizing AfCFTA

ENA: 19 March 2025

The special economic zones and investments in agriculture, aviation and road transport sectors would position Ethiopia in optimizing the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA), UNECA Regional Integration and Trade Division Director Stephen Karingi said. Speaking to ENA, the director stated that the role of Ethiopia in the continental integration is well and well documented, specifically in advancing the AfCFTA. Under the AfCFTA, the nation can take advantage of the continental free trade area and sits in a very advantageous position, he added.

In this respect, Karingi revealed that Ethiopia is making a lot of progress in terms of preparing its national AfCFTA implementation strategy, urging the other countries to have national implementation mechanisms. According to him, the special economic zones that have been developed and investments in sectors such as aviation, agriculture and transport would position Ethiopia to utilize AfCFTA’s potential.

“If you look at the special economic zones and at the investments in aviation, rural and road transport sectors, all these investments position Ethiopia in a very strong or pole position in optimizing the AfCFTA.”

The economic zones of the country can supply products for domestic demand of the large population of Ethiopia, and also would take the advantage of the 1.5 billion people under the continental free trade area by supplying skills and the resources, he elaborated. Karingi believes that Ethiopia’s economic investments over the past decade and a half are exemplary, and the initiatives encouraging other African nations to transition from guided trade initiatives to more universal trading practices.

This transformation is essential for realizing the full potential of the AfCFTA, reflecting a growing confidence in the country’s ability to navigate the complexities of the continental free trade area and capitalize on the benefits it offers, he added.

“Strategically speaking, I think the investments over the last 10-15 years really position Ethiopia probably to be really pushing everybody to make their tariff concessions so that we move from the guided trade initiative to universal trading under the AfCFTA.”
