## 5. Authority Raises Minimum Capital Requirements for Coffee Exporters

**The Reporter: September 13, 2025**

The Ethiopian Coffee and Tea Authority has raised minimum capital thresholds for individuals and businesses looking to get involved in the coffee export business.

Private exporters are required to have at least 15 million Birr in capital, according to the 'Coffee Marketing and Quality Control Directive,' while the floor is 20 million Birr for share and private limited companies.

This is the second time the Authority is changing the minimum requirements this year, with the previous amendment seeing the capital threshold jump to 10 million Birr from 1.5 million.

Both private and company exporters are required to present bank statements and disclose ownership structure in order to attain a certificate of competency from the Authority, according to the directive.

## 6. Intra-African Trade Fair Secures 48 Billion USD in Deals in Algiers

**ENA: September 11, 2025**

The fourth Intra-African Trade Fair (IATF 2025) closed in Algiers on Wednesday with a record 48.2 billion USD in deals, the African Export-Import Bank (Afreximbank) said.

Afreximbank President Benedict Oramah called the outcome the most successful since the fair's launch, exceeding earlier projections of 44 billion USD. Algeria accounted for 11.6 billion USD, or nearly a quarter of the total.

The agreements covered sectors including agriculture, energy, finance, health, and transport.

The fair, organised by Afreximbank, the African Union and the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) Secretariat, ran from Sept. 4 to 10 and drew more than 35,000 participants and 2,000 exhibitors from over 75 countries.

President Abdelmadjid Tebboune, who opened the event, urged greater African economic integration, noting the continent's 3 percent share of global trade despite its vast resources and population.

Hosting for the first time, Algeria showcased energy, agriculture, and manufacturing industries.

In a statement issued at the conclusion of the fair, the organizers emphasized the importance of the critical importance of ensuring that the nearly 48.2 billion worth of trade and investment deals

## 7. Kenya Ready To Purchase GERD Power To Boost Industry And Regional Integration

**FMC: September 9, 2025**

Kenyan President William Ruto today confirmed Kenya's readiness to sign an expanded power purchase agreement with Ethiopia to offtake surplus electricity from the Grand Ethiopian Renaissance Dam (GERD), following its historic inauguration earlier today.

The dam, Africa's largest hydroelectric facility with an estimated capacity of 6,450 megawatts, was fully financed by Ethiopian citizens, showcasing the nation's commitment to self-reliance and continental progress.

"The Grand Ethiopian Renaissance Dam is a bold affirmation of Africa's ability to marshal its own resources and shape its destiny," President Ruto said during the inauguration ceremony. "We believe that no country should be denied the opportunity to unlock a vast resource such as the one we are witnessing today."

President Ruto praised Ethiopians for delivering the GERD without relying on foreign debt or external support, calling the achievement a "living example of regional integration" and a model for other African nations.

He also highlighted the growing partnership between Kenya and Ethiopia in clean energy, noting that securing additional power from the GERD will enhance Kenya's industrial zones, ICT hubs, and broader economic agenda, particularly during periods of drought.

## 8. Exporters face major disruptions due to inefficient communication with NBE

**Capital News: September 14, 2025**

Exporters are attributing significant disruptions to their export activities to a lack of modern systems and poor communication between financial institutions and the National Bank of Ethiopia (NBE).

Many exporters recalled that the process was much simpler in the past, but has now become exceedingly challenging, complicating their ability to schedule shipments in line with customer demands.

The exporters explained that problems arise when they approach their commercial banks to apply for export permits, only to encounter unexpected delays because the central bank has barred them from obtaining one.

They noted that the previous system was crucial for planning their export schedules in alignment with rail and shipping freight programs. "Nowadays, this system is unavailable," they said, necessitating physical trips to the NBE office.

Exporters also revealed that the NBE is including them on delinquent lists—a system intended to identify those who have failed to meet foreign exchange obligations or have accounts with bounced checks—for very small amounts of money.
