5. ECX mandates centralized payments for oilseeds, pulses exports

Capital: November 30, 2025

In a pivotal move to enhance transparency and safeguard foreign exchange earnings, the Ministry of Trade and Regional Integration (MOTRI) has issued Directive No. 1115/2025, mandating that all exporter payments for oilseeds and pulses route exclusively through the Ethiopian Commodity Exchange (ECX). This amendment to Directive No. 1026/2024 eliminates direct bank transfers between exporters and suppliers, addressing longstanding vulnerabilities in these critical export sectors.

Minister Kassahun Gofe highlighted systemic gaps in direct marketing—initially introduced to cut logistics costs and intermediaries—that eroded sector competitiveness and imposed financial strains on suppliers. “This reform closes loopholes, ensures accurate transaction recording, and provides verified pricing for export applications,” the ministry stated in a memorandum urging ECX, export executives, and regional bureaus for swift implementation.

ECX’s integrated clearing and settlement, already featuring next-day (T+1) payments via partnerships with banks like Commercial Bank of Ethiopia and Dashen Bank, guarantees supplier payments while offering exporters precise quantity and quality data. Experts note this curbs money laundering, boosts revenue tracking, and reduces risks, fostering a competitive environment amid global demand projected to rise from \$82 billion in 2025 to \$143 billion by 2035.

6. Deputy PM Calls On Partners To Make Ethiopia Global Leader In Coffee, Tea, And Spices

FMC: November 25, 2025

Ethiopia’s Deputy Prime Minister Temesgen Truneh has called on all partners in the country’s coffee, tea, and spice sectors to redouble their efforts to position Ethiopia as the undisputed global leader.

He highlighted the sector’s recent achievements, noting that strategic prioritization and collaboration across the value chain have enabled many farmers to rise from hardship to prosperity, with some now recognized as successful entrepreneurs and millionaires.

In the 2017 E.C. budget year, Ethiopia exported a record 470,000 tons of coffee, generating USD 2.65 billion in revenue. For the 2025/26 fiscal year, the government aims to export 600,000 tons of coffee and exceed USD 3 billion in revenue.

Deputy PM Temesgen urged sector partners to act with “urgency, precision, and excellence” to improve quality standards, expand value addition, and enhance Ethiopia’s competitiveness on the global stage.

7. Ethiopia Ready to Gamble on Sustainable Aviation Fuel

Ethiopia has formally begun positioning itself as a producer of sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) following the conclusion of a national feasibility study which confirmed that the country has both the land and renewable energy capacity for supplying the emerging global aviation fuel market.

During a multi-stakeholder validation workshop held in Addis Ababa’s Skylight Hotel on Thursday November 27, experts presenting the feasibility study told officials and industry representatives that Ethiopia could produce low-carbon aviation fuel using local agricultural crops, municipal waste, sugar byproducts and renewable energy sources.

The findings were presented to senior representatives from the ministries of Transport and Logistics, Agriculture, the Civil Aviation Authority, universities and private investors during a final validation workshop attended by international consultants and donors, including the European Union, which funded the study through the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO). The feasibility study launched in December 2024 with a national workshop and followed by field consultations and a March 2025 stakeholder conference, where Ethiopian officials engaged with technical experts to review data and evaluate business readiness for domestic SAF production.

8. NBE Re-Licenses Standard Bank Office As First Foreign Institution Under Revised Banking Proclamation

The National Bank of Ethiopia (NBE) has formally re-licensed Standard Bank’s Representative Office, marking the first foreign banking institution to be licensed under Ethiopia’s newly revised Banking Business Proclamation.

The central bank said the re-licensing follows a structural shift that places the regulation and supervision of foreign bank Representative Offices (REPOs) under NBE’s mandate. Previously, REPOs operated under licenses issued by the Ministry of Trade and Regional Integration. NBE has now begun re-licensing these offices and reviewing new applications in line with the updated framework.

Standard Bank, which has maintained a presence in Ethiopia through its representative office, is the first to complete the transition process.
